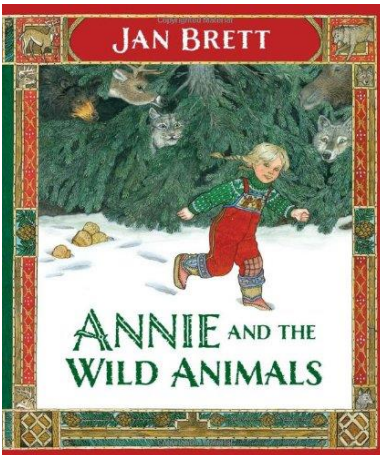
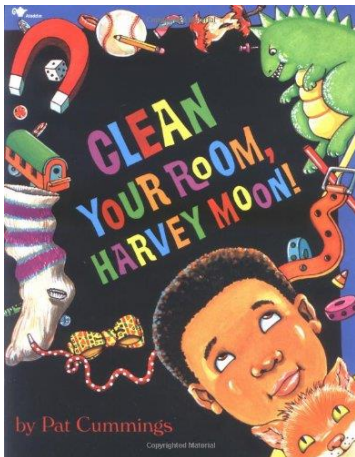


Book List for 3-5 year olds



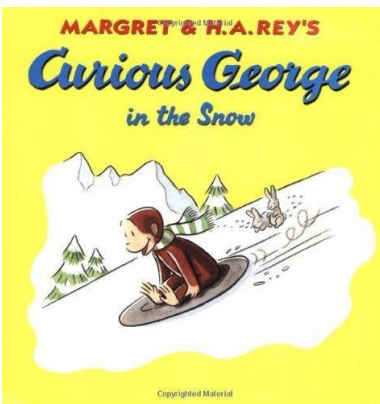
Annie and the Wild Animals by Jan Brett

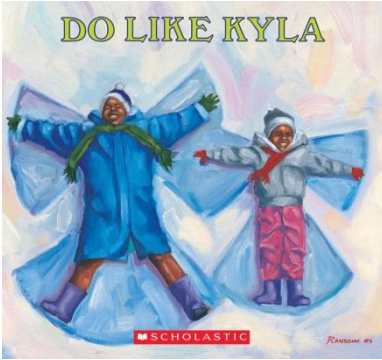
Clean Your Room, Harvey Moon! by Pat Cummings

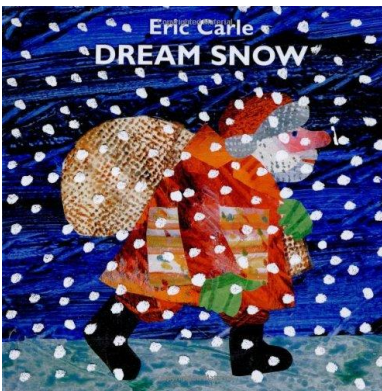
Curious George in the Snow by Margret Rey

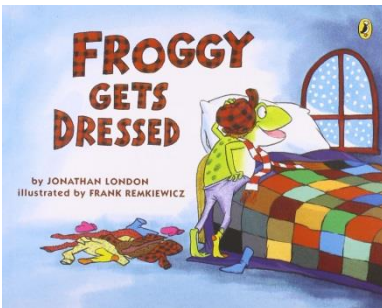
Do Like Kyla by Angela Johnson

A little girl imitates her big sister Kyla all day, until in the evening Kyla imitates her.



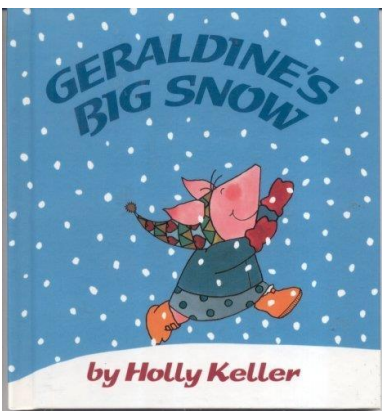
Dream Snow by Eric Carle

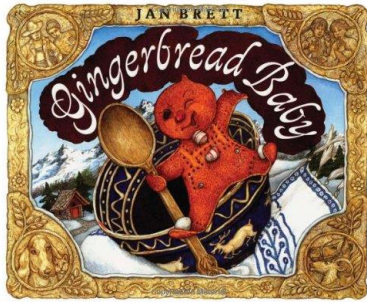
Froggy Gets Dressed by Jonathan London

Rambunctious Froggy hops out into the snow for a winter frolic but is called back by his mother to put on some necessary articles of clothing.



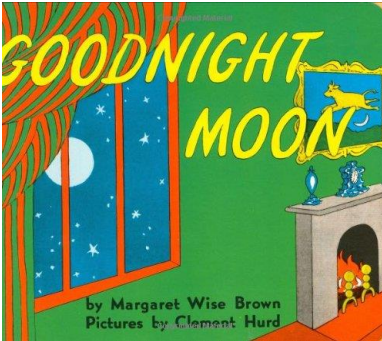
Geraldine's Big Snow by Holly Keller

Geraldine can't wait for the snow to come so that she can coast down the hill on her sled.



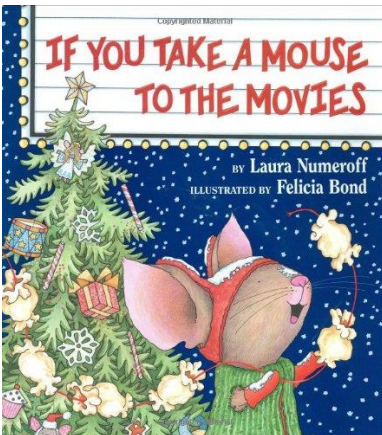
Gingerbread Baby by Jan Brett

Remember how the Gingerbread Boy is eaten by the fox? Well, not this Gingerbread Baby in a delicious twist to a favorite old tale.



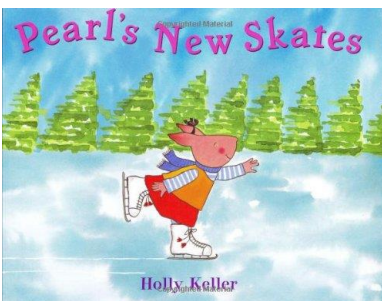
Goodnight Moon by Margaret Wise Brown

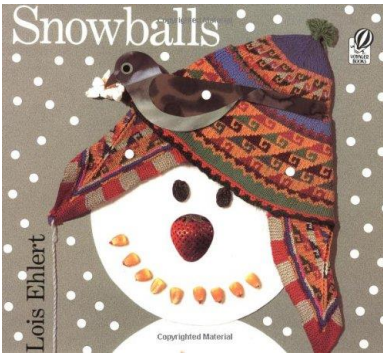
If You Take a Mouse to the Movies by Laura Numeroff

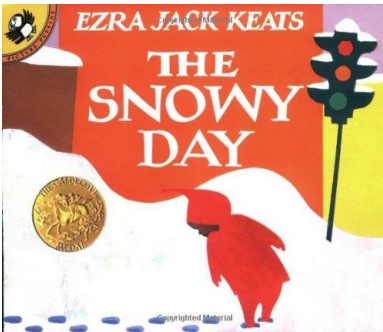
Pearl's New Skates by Holly Keller

Will Pearl ever skate in real life the way she skates in her dreams?



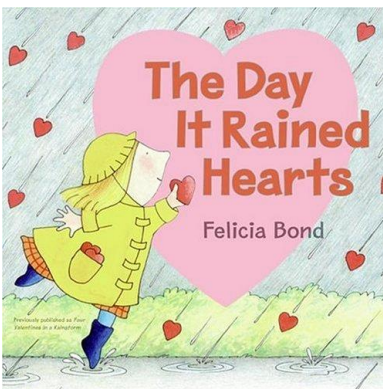
Snowballs by Lois Ehlert

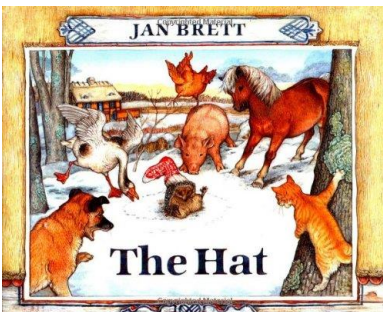
Snowy Day by Ezra Keats
