What is Transition?

- Transition is a process of changing from one form, state, activity or place to another.
- Why is it so important for young children and their families?

10 Elements of an Effective Transition Plan- Robert Pianta

1. Establish positive relationships among the children, parents and educators
2. Facilitates each child's development as a capable learner
3. Differentiates between orientation to school and transition to school

10 Elements of an Effective Transition Plan- Robert Pianta

4. Draws upon dedicated funding and resources
5. Involves a range of stakeholders
6. Well planned and evaluated

10 Elements Continued

7. Flexible and responsive
8. Based on mutual trust and respect
9. Rely on reciprocal communication among participants
10. Takes into account the contextual aspects of the community

K Registration Process

Tailor to individual needs

- K Teachers take each child and do a variety of readiness assessments.
- Based on the work of IU 13
- Letter/Sound ID, Book Handling, early numeracy and name writing.
