


The mission of the TFEC Early Education Initiative is to cultivate, convene, and strengthen community opportunities for growth, safety, and wellness for all children, now and for future generations.




## **Early Education Assistance Fund**

TFEC offered early education assistance for families in Dauphin, Cumberland, Perry, Franklin, Lebanon and Northern York counties through its Early Education Assistance Fund.

The Fund provides opportunities to eligible Pre-K students ages 3 to 5 years old to attend a quality early learning center or preschool program located in TFEC's service area. TFEC awarded \$29,152 to 10 families in 2023.
