Currently, my family is going through a financial crisis. During the summer of 2018, my father was admitted to the hospital because of an abdominal hernia that gone wrong. The mesh that was placed during the initial surgery became infected. The infection caused him to develop pneumonia and left him in a coma for three months, He was in the hospital the entire summer, half of that was spent in the Intensive Care Unit. When he was released from the hospital, he became too weak and physically unstable to continue any hard labor. He was forced to retire and receive help from the government, by being on welfare. My father was our main provider in the family, and since he is unfit to work, the responsibilities are now own my mother. She is now in charge of paying the mortgage, the utility bills and providing food and clothing for the family. We barely survive on our own. We are forced to live by check-to-check. Our financial aid situation intensified dramatically, that I had to get a part-time job, to aid my mother with the bills. However, I am still obligated to be a full-time student, and take care of my younger siblings. Now, that I am a college student, that is away from home, it is very hard to help my mother. I am not working, but I do the best to send money, that I have saved up, to my mother for the bills. There would be times where my mother tries to send me money for books and food, but I insist and tell her to save the money for the bills. As for me, college alone is very stressful, but to also focus on family issues, puts more weight and pressure on my shoulders. However, my circumstance is my motivation. I work very hard in school, to be successful. Thus, hoping that one day, I do not have to worry about financial issues.

Education is far the most influential tool that helps guide people in a direction that no other tool can compare. Being educated is much more than the awards and diplomas that one receives following the completion of a degree, it also provides the basis of one's perception of the world. In today's society that is characterized by economic insecurity, the value of education has increased exponentially. While one can take an individual's material items, nobody can take the knowledge that one possesses. Education alone has a strong impact on one's future, however, in my story, my personal experiences also shape my perspective on the future. As an incoming freshman into undergrad, I was uncertain about which career path would be right for me. Mistakenly, I majored in Journalism. I was confident that I would one day become a photojournalist for *National Geographic Magazine*. However, plans changed. After exposing myself to medicine, I realized that I wanted to help people as a health care professional. My life changed when my father underwent a hernia surgery that went wrong. For many years, my father's retail job required him to lift heavy boxes, causing him to weaken his abdominal wall. In 2004, he was diagnosed with an abdominal hernia. Due to financial reasons, it was not until the summer of 2018 when he went into surgery to fix the protrusion. Complications began after the surgery when the mesh became infected. He was immediately transferred to ICU where he went into a coma for three months. The Nurses, Physicians, and the Physician Assistant made sure my father received the best care possible. This specific tragedy changed my perspective on health professionals. It was at that moment when I envision myself as a Physician Assistant.

I have chosen to attend Temple University to continue my post-secondary education. Temple University provides a great public health program. The program has prepared and educated me, personally regarding extensive public health concerns, that I am now aware of and engaged in. It ranges from individual disease prevention and disease through epidemiological assessment. Also, I believe completing my undergraduate degree at Temple University, will not only prepare me to be accepted into a Master of Physician Assistant program, but it will also guide me through life. The connections that I have made while a student at Temple University has provided me with a research volunteer opportunity at the Lewis Kratz Medical School, and then received a job offer due to my hard work. Not only does Temple University satisfy my academic needs, but also personally, it is a good choice. Temple University is not far from home and it is located in a city that I am familiar with. Attending Temple University has been the best decision I have ever made.
