Junior Achievement of South Central PA 2023 Grant Recipient of \$6,000

Project and Community Need:
Junior Achievement of South Central PA
empowers young people to own their
economic success. The volunteer-delivered.



K-12 programs foster work-readiness, entrepreneurship and financial literacy skills, and use experiential learning to inspire kids to dream big and reach their potential. In 2023, Junior Achievement was awarded \$6,000 to support programs in the Mechanicsburg and Cumberland Valley School Districts. Through this grant, Junior Achievement was able to offer BizTown for students in fifth and sixth grade and YES (Your Economic Success) for students in grades sixth, seventh, and eighth. All Junior Achievement programs are provided at no cost to the schools or students.

PREVIOUS GRANTEE IMPACT

New Hope Ministries

2022 Grantee Recipient of \$10,000 Total number of individuals served: 4,762



Project and Community Need:

New Hope Ministries is a non-profit organization that offers assistance to Mechanicsburg area residents in need. We provide basic resources such as food, housing, heat and utilities, transportation, workforce development, and job training to low to moderate-income individuals and families. Our services are aimed at helping those who are facing financial crisis, including single parents, seniors living in poverty, and the working poor (known as ALICE: Asset Limited Income Constrained Employed). We meet people where they are and provide them with the tools and resources needed to achieve self-sufficiency. In the context of this grant, we served a total of 4,762 individuals from 1,667 families residing in the 17050 and 17055 zip code. This represents an increase of over 30% from the same time period last year.

Success:

"There were so many successes at our Mechanicsburg Center over this past year. We would like to highlight Ms. Chepkong, a Mechanicsburg resident who attended our April 2023 nurse aide pre-clinical class. She did superb during the pre-clinical training and has passed her two nurse aide state exams to earn her nurse aide certification. We just found out she recently started a new job," said Michelle Zemba, Development Coordinator, New Hope Ministries.
