

as a student in my Advanced Placement English Language & Composition course during his junior year. He was conscientious and engaged, participating avidly in class discussion and taking advantage of opportunities to grow and improve both his critical thinking and writing skills.
Where I've had a chance to get to know best, however, is as a student leader outside of the classroom. As the coach for the high school forensics team, I immediately tagged as a potential candidate for our fledgling debate squad. His unique combination of an outgoing nature, natural curiosity, and open-minded approach to controversial issues made him an ideal candidate to take on the task of debating on either side of contentious issues. My faith in him was well founded: has competed in both Lincoln Douglas and Congressional debate over the past two seasons and proven himself to be an avid competitor
's involvement in the school extends far beyond the Speech & Debate team. He is also actively involved in the high school's award-winning instrumental music program as well as Model United Nations and the Technology Student Association (TSA). Not to mention his work outside of the school with the Chesapeake Bay Foundation. I believe this is a testament to learning makes him an ideal candidate for Penn State's Schreyer Honors College.
Finally (and at the risk of sounding over-the-top) I feel I must mention remarkable equanimity in matters of politics. The best evidence of this can be seen (heard) in the independently produced podcast he created with a former MASH student on the opposite end of the political spectrum. "What America Needs" attempts to model reasoned, rational discussion about contentious issues in contemporary American politics. The podcast (available on Spotify) has already recorded 16 episodes and featured interviews with several high-profile local political candidates including Rep. Sheryl Delozier, Cumberland County Commissioner Jean Foschi, and Tom Brier, a candidate for the 10 th Congressional District seat. The fact that a senior in high school – can facilitate this level of dialogue speaks volumes about his character.
When I despair for the future of our nation (as I've unfortunately had ample cause to do recently) I am encouraged by the knowledge that there are students like who are graduating from high schools around the country and heading on to post-secondary experiences that will further prepare them to solve the challenges facing America and the world. I feel incredibly fortunate to have had the opportunity to get to know while he was a student here at Mechanicsburg and I believe that he is more than a deserving candidate for the Anil and Neema Thakrar Family Fund Scholarship.
