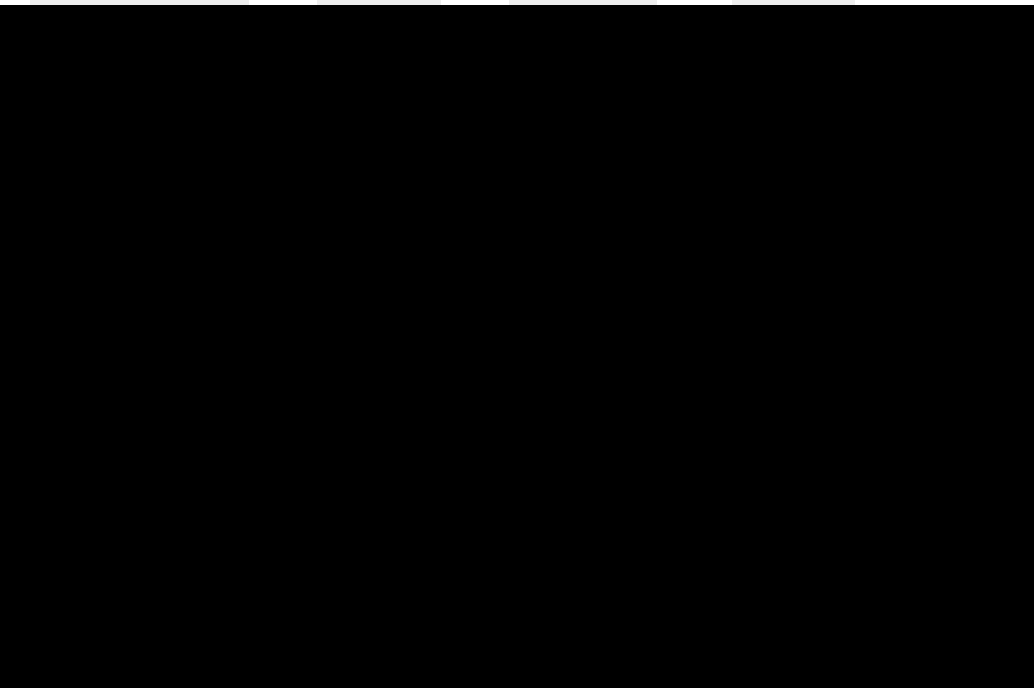

The summer programming there is an important continuation of their educational pursuits during the school year, and the camps are filled not only with fun, but also science experiments, museum tours, and other educational activities. I’ve loved serving in this capacity, as the “Community Classroom” seeks to meet both the physical and intellectual needs of these kids. Furthermore, children are arguably one of the most important groups that can be impacted. By providing emotional support and intellectual stimulation to a community of kids that would otherwise be devoid of it, we can create a lasting impact on the world, even far beyond our lifetime.

Another population near to my heart is individuals with special needs. I’ve enjoyed serving in Special Olympics, playing in our school’s Unified Sports Interscholastic Bocce Team, and being

a buddy in our school's "Pals@MASH" program. Our "Pals@MASH" program is particularly impactful, as we enjoy taking our special education students on monthly outings into the community. This not only provides the students with experiences to give them a positive high school experience, but also promotes a better climate for these individuals in the school and community.

Through these incredible experiences, I've become more aware of populations that are in need in my community, and I wish to continue to impact them through my career choices. Inspired by my love for kids and camp, I will spend the next year on a ministry team called "Encounter Revival Ministries"- which focuses specifically on children and youth outreach both nationally and internationally, and spends the summer counseling at local camp. Afterwards, I plan to attend Messiah College and pursue a degree in Occupational Therapy, with the intention of eventually impacting the geriatric and special-needs populations in my practice. Ultimately, I hope to live an intentional life that positively impacts the lives of those around me.

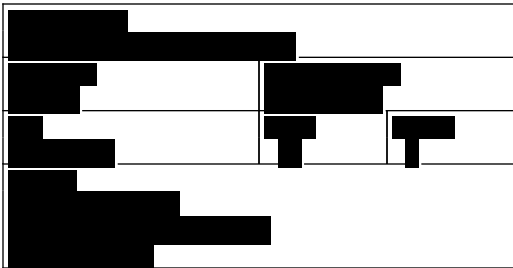
