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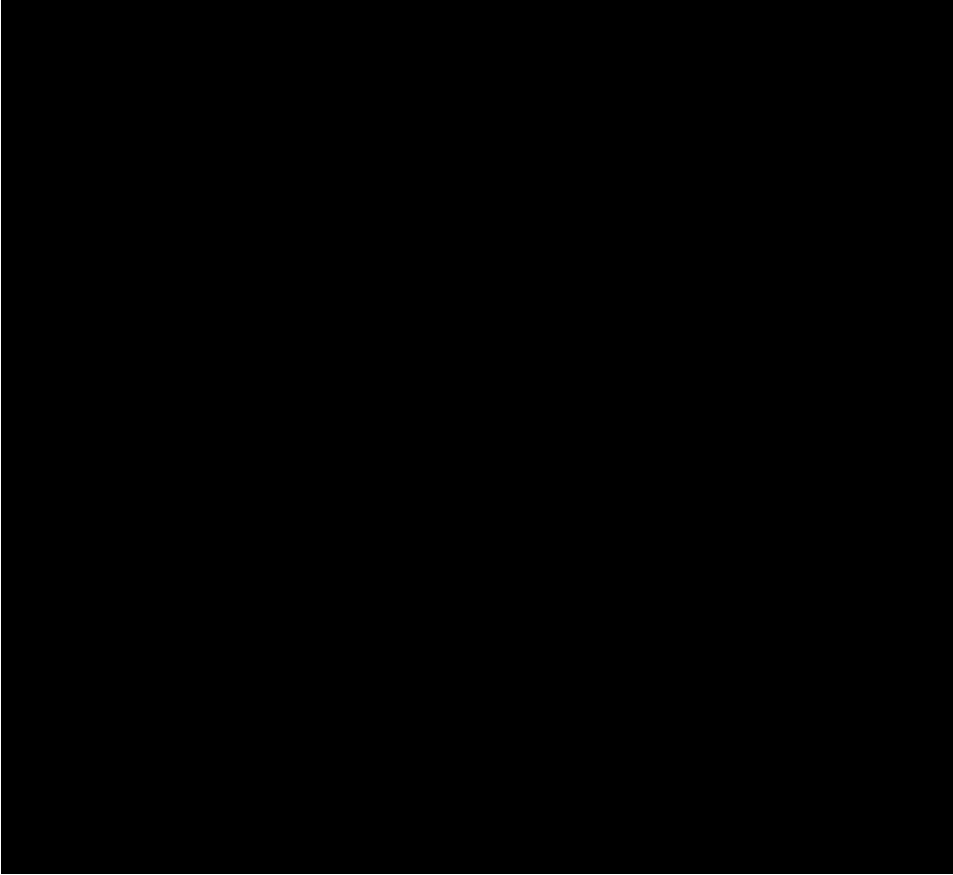

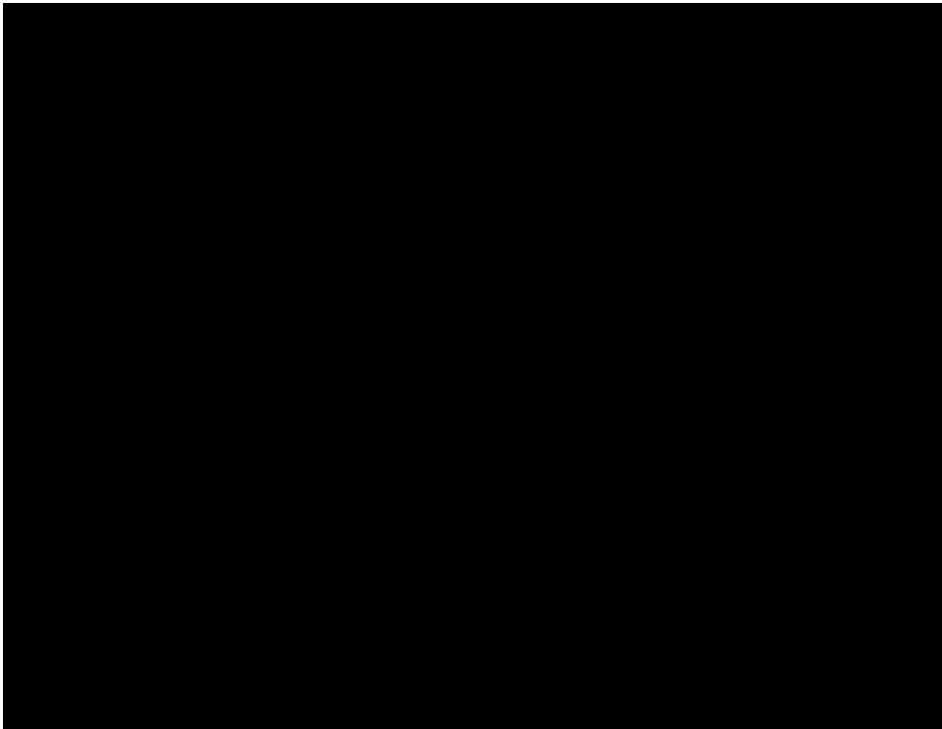

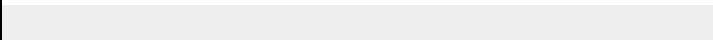

Foodless Feast is an event held in November every year before Thanksgiving. As a youth group, we have a goal to raise about \$17,000, but individually we raise \$100 or more. We fast for thirty hours over the weekend, and while fasting, we go out in our community and perform service projects. I volunteered at Operation Wildcat, Feed My Starving Children, and Love the Hill in Harrisburg. One year, I volunteered at Central Pennsylvania Food Bank to make meals for families struggling financially and feed them for the holidays. Participating opened my eyes to see how much need is in our community and world. Many families cannot even get one meal a day, yet they had some of the biggest smiles I have ever seen when they got to receive a Thanksgiving meal.

Serve is a summer camp for kids with special needs (intellectual and physical disabilities). I volunteered for one week with these kids in the summer of 2017 planning fun summer events, taking them to do service projects, and helping them grow closer to Christ. I formed great bonds with these wonderful kids, and it was hard to say goodbye when it ended. During that time it made me realize to never look down on people with special needs as any different from me.

I volunteered at Operation Wildcat and Pink Hands of Hope with my church youth group and my school softball team to organize clothes and unpack donated bags for families in our community at least ten times over the last four years. Pink Hands of Hope is a local non-profit dedicated to assisting women going through breast cancer treatment. This event helped me realize that putting others' needs before my own can change someone's life.

I have also had the opportunity to help serve dinners at Bethesda Men's Shelter with my family on multiple occasions over the last few years. It made me feel grateful for what I have.

Finally, I had the opportunity to go to Johannesburg, South Africa for two weeks in the summer of 2019 with teens from my church. We spent time with students from 1st-7th grade at a small boarding school which bordered a local shanty town. We taught school and ended the day with Bible lessons. This was one of the best experiences of my life. These kids taught me to smile even on days I didn't want to, and that we are all family no matter how far across the sea, no matter what color, or gender. These kids had little to almost nothing yet they were still thankful for everything they had.

I plan to make service a part of my life by volunteering in local organizations. It is such an amazing experience to know you are helping your own community. Going off to college next year might be a challenge but I plan to find a church to get involved in, so I can continue serving.

Dear Operation Wildcat,

I am writing to highly recommend [REDACTED] for your consideration for financial assistance as she enrolls in college.

I have known [REDACTED] since she was four years old. My wife and I were foster parents with The Bair Foundation and [REDACTED] came into our home and our hearts as a foster child. When she came to us, she did not know her alphabet, numbers, or colors and there was some concern about whether she could even talk. Several members of her immediate family had intellectual disabilities so there was some thought that she, too, might be disabled. My wife worked tirelessly with [REDACTED] over the next year to prepare her for enrollment in kindergarten. Her drive to learn and achieve new skills when given the opportunity was very evident and she was fully ready not only to go to kindergarten but to be a very good student throughout her school years. She continues to work diligently on her school assignments.

When [REDACTED] was in first grade, she became eligible for adoption. After a lot of prayer, discussion, and tears, my wife and I decided it was not in her best interest for us to adopt her because of our age and we were "empty nesters." We believed that [REDACTED] needed younger parents because she was a very active and athletic girl and she needed siblings to continue to develop socially. To this day, the decision not to adopt [REDACTED] is the most difficult, heart-wrenching decision of our lives but the correct one.

We approached [REDACTED], friends here at West Shore Evangelical Free Church, to see if they would adopt her. After several weeks of talks and observations, they determined that the Lord was leading them to adopt her. They have been the perfect parents for [REDACTED], and they have been very gracious over the years to allow us to continue being involved in her life

[REDACTED] accepted Jesus Christ as her Savior as a child and has always been active in church and serving others. She was involved every week in her Sunday School classes, children's choir, and youth ministries. She also participated in our Upward Basketball ministry, FAZ 6 ministry for 6th graders, and children and youth retreats. She was always engaged in special community and mission projects like the Cumberland Pointe block parties, Foodless Feast to raise money for local organizations assisting the homeless, and Feed My Starving Children in which she and hundreds of other volunteers pack hundreds of thousands of meals to be sent overseas to children in need of food. [REDACTED] continues to be actively involved in our church and these community outreaches. Last summer, she joined our church's youth mission team to serve for two weeks in South Africa with elementary-age children. It was one of the best experiences of her life and it had a significant impact on how she views the world and her role in it.

On February 9, [REDACTED] was baptized. This girl who came to us with others unsure if she could even talk, stood before 1,000 people and gave testimony to how Jesus Christ saved her and has worked in her life. Jesus has enabled her to embrace her foster care and adoption past and she declared that she would not change a thing about her life. For someone who has gone through foster care and adoption, this is a real testimony to the grace of God at work in her life.

[REDACTED] has a true servant's heart to serve Jesus Christ and others. Her plans are to attend college and major in occupational therapy. I hope and pray that the Lord will also open opportunities for her to share her foster care and adoption testimony with others who struggle with those experiences in their history.

Given the past obstacles in her life that she has had to overcome and the amazing young woman that she has become today, I believe [REDACTED] is worthy of your attention for financial assistance. Thank you very much for your time and consideration.
