

In 2023, PCCF awarded Join Hands Ministry \$3,500 to support their Outreach and Assistance Program - Back-to-School (B2S). From equipping backpacks with essential school supplies like pencils, notebooks, and markers, to providing new clothing, shoes, and winter coats, our dedication to supporting Perry County students is unwavering.

Success:

Building on the success of their 2023 season, where Join Hands Ministry proudly served 437 children, the organization continues to make a tangible difference in the lives of Perry County students. With an impressive 100% of children receiving backpacks, school supplies, and clothing, alongside 87% receiving new shoes, and 78% receiving winter coats, Join Hands Ministry's commitment remains steadfast. With continued and new partnerships, the organization aims to surpass these achievements, ensuring every child in the community receives the resources they need to thrive academically and beyond.

Performances included those of Cumberland Honey, an award-winning trio which features folk, soul, and a taste of bluegrass; Americana artist Kevin Neidig, winner of the CPHOF Best Americana Artist 2023 Award & 2023 Falcon Ridge Folk Fest Emerging Artist; Tangled Up in Dead, a stunning Bob Dylan-Grateful Dead tribute band comprised of road-tested troubadours; DANDY, a well-loved musical duo from Harrisburg, PA, consisting of brothers Jordan and Cory Dandy, spreading a positive and uplifting atmosphere through music; and Big Sky Quartet, an award-winning folk/roots band from Central Pennsylvania performing throughout the Eastern United States, known for its glowing three-part harmonies, moving melodies, and uplifting live performances.
