PennCares is a community based organization that provides early intervention, work opportunities, and life long supports services, addressing the full continuum of care with dedication, skill and a commitment to quality support and individual empowerment while prompting independence.

The Sensory Friendly Community Event Series is a series of sensory friendly events. The aim of this series is to provide the opportunity for children with sensory processing, autism or other special needs an opportunity to participate in sensory friendly versions of typical community events. Events such as Sensory Friendly Egg-Stravaganza, Fall Fest, Fourth of July Celebration and Sensitive Santa. These events give families a way to experience the simplicities of childhood that often times are incredibly challenging and overwhelming for individuals with sensory processing, autism and other special needs.

The Sensory Friendly Community Event Series is a series of sensory friendly events that will take place at Mongahan Presbyterian Church located at 1185 Gettysburg Pike in Dillsburg, PA and Grace Brethren Church in Franklin County. The Sensory Friendly Community Events Series is aimed to serve families who have children with sensory processing disorder, autism or other special needs. Often times, when children have some sort of sensory need, a "simple" community outing such as going to an egg hunt or seeing santa is too overwhelming and can lead to meltdowns. By providing sensory friendly versions of typical community events, this allows ALL families to attend community events and be successful. The need for these events was inspired by the positive response and feedback from the Sensory Friendly Egg-Stravaganza that took place on April 13, 2019 at Monaghan Prebsyterian Church. The event had twenty five children registred and twenty two children attended which was a great turnout for an innagural event. The feedback from that event was 100% positive and families requested more events. Based upon this feedback, PennCares and Monaghan Prebsyterian Church collaborated and offered the first Sensory Friendly Santa on December 21, 2019. Twenty one children and their familes

attended this event. The overwhelming response to this event was gratitude. One mother hugged the organizer of the event and said "You have no idea how much this means to us. This is big deal for our family." Together with community partners, PennCares is planning to offer the following sensory friendly events: Mar 27, 2021-9-11am -Sensory Friendly Egg-Stravaganza, July 3, 2021 5-7pm -Friendly Fireworks: A Sensory Friendly event to celebrate Independence Day, October 30, 2021 9-11am Sensory Friendly Fall Fest and December 18, 2021 9-11am Sensitive Santa. All of the dates and times are confirmed. Grant funds will be used on event materials such as LED Easter eggs, prizes for Easter eggs, snacks, craft supplies, gross motor equipment, books, sensory tactile toys and sensory bin items.

#### FUNDING

PennCares is seeking \$1422.00 for The Sensory Friendly Community Event Series. This would enable PennCares to offer events year round. Monaghan Presbyterian church has committed to funding the cost of plastic Easter eggs used at the Sensory Friendly Egg-Stravaganza as well as the candy inside the eggs. Mr.Carr has generously donated his services as Santa Claus. Blue Moose Solutions is committed to sponsoring cost of photography for the events. If the proposal is not funded at the level requested, the sensory friendly events would be limited to only the Sensory Friendly Egg-Stravaganza and Sensory Friendly Santa event. The Friendly Fireworks and Fall Fest would not be able to be carried out due to budget constraints.

The success of The Sensory Friendly Community Event Series success will be based on numbers served and family surveys. Registration will be required for these events and thus it will be easy generate the numbers served based on registration and event attendance. PennCares will also be obtaining photos of the events and posting these on social media to share our successes with the community.

The Sensory Friendly Community Event Series is open to people of ALL abilities. While these events are targeted at individuals with sensory needs, it is welcome to all. All of the building is ADA compliant and on a level surface. These events are free to the community. Extra care was taken into consideration when developing these events. There are two sensory rooms located within the church that participants can use to decompress if needed. Volunteers are trained to be compassionate and patient. Past volunteers include an occupational therapist, a physical therapist and special education teachers. All activities can be adapted to meet the need of each participant. On the registration form, there is a box that participants can check if they require special accomodations such as noise cancelling head sets, dietary restrictions, etc.

To whom it may concern:

I am writing on behalf of Monaghan Presbyterian Church and our partnership program with PennCares. For the past two years Monaghan has been engaged in a conversation with PennCares on ways to reach out to the families in our community with special needs and challenges.

Our congregation has been blessed in the past several years with many families worshipping with us who have children with special needs, auditory and sensory sensitivities. As we have embraced these families we realized how challenging things we take for granted can be, especially for the youngest amongst us.

In talking with PennCares our eyes have been opened to the countless ways we can open our home up to the community. We began with reimagining two of our spaces. One was what we called the cry room, a room where families could bring squirmy children and still see and experience worship. This space has been reimagined and is being transformed into a tranquility space, wonderful for kids who just might need a quieter environment. Our traditional nursery is being reimagined to be a moving and grooving space, with areas for kids who just need a safe place to let it out.

It has been amazing to watch the church embrace this partnership and project and even come up with new activities. From this conversation came the idea for a sensory friendly Easter egg hunt. We held that in partnership with PennCares this past April and it was a wonderful experience. It was such a great experience that we have committed to hosting a sensory friendly Santa event as well. It got church people excited to do more.

It is our hope through this grant process to be able to partner even more closely with PennCares to offer four events next year. In addition to the Sensory Friendly Egg-Stravaganza; we have agreed to host a fall festival, sensitive Santa and sensory friendly fireworks. How wonderful it would be for kids in our community to be able to experience things that they wouldn't normally be able to. Hearing from families who attended the events that their kids had never been to one before, that made us realize that our role in our community is not to create big huge events for everyone, but to help create events for those who are left out of those events.

We look forward to partnering with PennCares on many different ideas. We are excited to see where this journey takes us. Thank you for considering us in this grant process.
