APPLICANT ORGANIZATION MISSION STATEMENT

Setebaid Services' mission is to (1) enhance the quality of life for people with diabetes by educating them to accept diabetes and maintain good glycemic control while living healthy lives; and to, (2) educate future healthcare professionals to effectively manage and treat people with diabetes; and to, (3) encourage diabetes research.

PROJECT SNAPSHOT

1. Capture your project and the community need it seeks to address in 200 words or less.

Diabetes (T1D) camps have been proven to improve diabetes management skills in youth living with T1D. A 1993 study by the American Diabetes Association showed those with better management skills reduced or eliminated diabetes complications.

2017 research showed those who are able to balance their blood sugar best have higher levels of diabetes-related stress which leads to depression and increased risks of suicide. Setebaid diabetes camps were shown to be the most effective support group to reduce this stress and reduce the complications of depression.

This grant request offers camperships, or camp scholarships, to low-income youth living with diabetes from this fund's service area; it provides the ability for these youth to attend our life-changing diabetes camps.

They will see, often for the first-time, they are not alone with this dreaded disease. The youth will have the ability to interact with their peers and share feelings only a peer living with diabetes would understand. The children will interact with adult role models living happy and successful lives while managing their diabetes. Each child will return home with a new outlook on life and new diabetes management skills which will enable them to live more independently while managing their own diabetes.

PROJECT NARRATIVE

Grant funds will be used to offer diabetes camp camperships. Type 1 Diabetes (T1D) Camp Camperships, or camp scholarships, are tuition assistance for youth living with T1D to attend diabetes education camp. The awards are made based upon the family's income level. Full camperships are awarded to campers whose families' household income is at or below a percentage of the poverty level and partial camperships are awarded on a sliding-fee schedule for those above this level.

Brittaney, a teen girl from Perry County living with T1D, came to camp in 2019. Her Grandmother, who helped raise her, said she was worried because Brittaney seemed depressed and her clinic visits didn't seem to help. She had been diagnosed with T1D ten years prior to diabetes camp in 2019. Her Grandmother was also concerned because Brittaney was always "in trouble" at school. Her Grandmother wanted to give Brittaney a chance in a new environment because she knew Brittaney was a bright girl.

At camp, Brittaney stood out as a leader in her cabin. Her medical staff was impressed with how she stood out as a positive role model with her peers. She tested her blood glucose and encouraged others in the cabin to test their blood sugars before dinner the first evening. As camp went on, Brittaney showed true leadership skills, especially when helping others manage their diabetes. Brittaney recognized having diabetes was the norm at camp, not a difference.

Brittaney's Grandmother said, for the first time she saw Brittaney as a leader, not a trouble-maker.

Setebaid diabetes camps serve many youth and families from throughout South Central Pennsylvania; this grant of campership funding will be used to fund children like Brittaney, from Cumberland, Dauphin, Franklin, Juniata, Lebanon, Mifflin, Perry, and Northern York (e.g. Dillsburg Area) Counties, to attend transformative diabetes camps.

The campership project will begin in early January, 2021 and run through August, 2021. We begin to accept campership applications after January 2, 2021. Financial Assistance applications are processed on a first-comefirst-served basis until all funds are exhausted. Money is awarded as it becomes available. The T1D camps will be held in July and August of 2021. The T1D camps are held in two locations: children ages 7-18 may attend camp in Bethel, PA (Lebanon and Berks Counties) from July 18-24, 2021. Children ages 7-14 may attend camp in Mifflinburg, PA (Union County) from August 1-7, 2021. These dates and locations are confirmed.

FUNDING

We are requesting \$3,200.00 toward camperships for youth who reside in Cumberland, Dauphin, Franklin, Juniata, Lebanon, Mifflin, Perry, or upper York Counties. The total estimated campership need for this service area is over \$80,029. We have just begun our fundraising for the 2021 campership fund. We have a committed \$10,146 toward this goal and continue to seek additional funding. We also have pending requests for another \$15,000. A partial grant would allow this project to continue; however, unfortunate decisions would need to be made allowing only some of those in-need to attend camp. Camperships would continue to be awarded to those in the GHCF Ben Franklin Trust Fund service area on a first-come-first-served basis. Partial funding would reduce the number of local residents served in the GHCF Ben Franklin Trust Fund service area.

PROJECT SUCCESS

Project success will be finding enough funding to accept ALL children and teens living with diabetes who want to attend our diabetes camps. We have confidence, after over 22 years of successful outcomes, once we have the campers at camp, they will benefit from the camp. Successful outcomes include increased independence in the campers so when they return home, they can participate in normal childhood activities like sleep overs and after-school activities like sports and arts or music programs.

Over the past several years (except in 2020 when all programs were offered virtually) we have had to turn away potential campers who could not afford to attend camp. While we have accepted hundreds of local children, we can only accept as many as funding permits. We now turn to the community to help us serve the families who need our help.

Setebaid Services uses outcome measures to ensure improvement in diabetes management skills; this will lead to reduced diabetes complications in the future and reduced diabetes-related stress in the campers. We also use the outcome measures to compare our outcomes with other camps nationally in the areas of increased independence, social skills, meeting new friends who are peers living with diabetes, and many other areas of youth development. All campers, including those who receive camperships, will complete youth outcomes batteries surveys. These surveys, developed by child psychologists nationally, measure program benefits for youth. The outcomes will be analyzied and compared to other groups throughout the United States. They measure an increase in independence, competance, diabetes management skills, and socialization. The surveys will be analyzed by research professionals to ensure reported results are statistically correct.
