I have always been motivated by my mom to do well; she is what fuels my ambition. To keep it short, she is a single parent that works everyday with the exception of Sunday and is pretty much restless. I recall moments where my mom would say to me: “I came home at three in the morning. My back hurts, my leg hurts – everything aches. Don’t settle for working like I did – do well in school, get a good job, and live comfortably. Live a better life than mom.” Hearing those remarks and seeing her busy body move everyday inspired me to exert the same amount of hard work and dedication into academics. However, the effort I put in is not entirely for acknowledgment and praise for the good work that I’ve done. Instead, it is for my own solace as living a better life is a priority.

On the days my mother and I would spend talking, I noticed the bruises that came apparent from working. I noticed her aching legs; her aching back; her aching feet. I noticed all things bad that came with working. I gave her massages, suggested that she should take Tylenol or Advil to relieve the pain. I recall at a young age, whenever my mother or someone around me started to cough my attention would immediately shift towards them. I would ask them if they were okay and if they needed water or a cough drop. If a friend started to feel ill, I would bombard them with questions: “Does your throat hurt?”, “Do you feel hot?”, “Are you short of breath?” This habit of asking people if they were okay and offering assistance as injury would appear has stuck with me as I continued to develop as a person.

As I deconstruct the experiences that have contributed to my growth as a person, it is evident that I am prone to be attentive towards those in needs. Because of my upbringing, it has influenced my decisions to ensure a better life for myself.

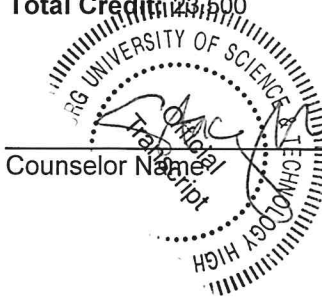
